- O Civics and Citizenship curriculum
- Three Cross-curriculum Priorities
- The General Capabilities of Critical and Creative Thinking, Personal and Social Capability, Ethical and Intercultural Understanding.

SCEAQ sees Civics and Citizenship as fundamental to the achievement of the National Goal in the 2019 Alice Springs (Mparntwe) Education Declaration, "that all young Australians will become active and informed members of the community".

- Encourages the teaching and learning of Social Education in Queensland at all levels of education, from early childhood to tertiary.
- Facilitates professional discussion and debate in support of effective Social Education.
- Provides professional learning for teachers (e.g. seminars, newsletters, online resources).

- Supports research about Social Education and cross-disciplinary teaching.
